Welcome back everyone to a new academic year here at Seagrave Primary school. It was lovely to welcome you all back after the Summer break (which feels like a distant memory now!). They have all settled in very well and are now an important part of our Seagrave family.





The children had only been back in school for a day when Seagrave held it's village fair. We were blessed with good weather and it was very well attended (thank you if you came to support this event). I think everyone had a super time and the fly past by the Lancaster bomber was the lowest and best I have seen! The profits made from the fair are shared evenly between the WI, the church, the Village hall and the school. The whole event made over £5000! Our school will be benefitting from a quarter of that amount to use on provision and resources to support the children.

Our school puts the health and well-being of your children in the centre of everything we do. In September, we were joined by Jo Bradbury who leads us through our mindful activities each day. She talked to the school about how to deal with emotions that can sometimes make us feel uncomfortable. The children continueto take part in daily mindfulness sessions appropriate to their age group.





In September the children in Class 3 organised the Macmillan coffee afternoon; which was a great success, raising just under £300. The children organised the event, ran the stalls and then counted up the takings and reported this back to Mrs Litchfield. All who attended seemed to have a good time. In October the school all visited the church for our annual Harvest festival. It was lovely to see the church full of children and their families. The children performed well

and the Class 3 children spoke clearly. Each class performed a song or poem, and the very youngest children confidently sang "Dingle Dangle scarecrow"

in front of everyone. The produce collected was distributed between John Storer house and Soar Valley food bank – it was gratefully received.

The children spent the first few days getting to know each other and exploring their new environment. Here are some pictures of our early days.




















On Wednesday of this week we enjoyed a day out at Twycross zoo. We all had a lot of fun despite the rain!

They were able to ask questions and learn all about the importance of a church for Christians. They learnt about the history of the church and key features of it too!









## Class 2 News

Class 2 have blown me away; with their eagerness and enthusiasm, upon entering the new academic year. What a busy start it has been! The children immersed themselves in our class topic this term - European Adventure, they have used world maps and atlases to identify Europe and explore these countries.











Here the children are investigating the nature of reflections in mirrors through a variety of practical tasks including mirror writing and navigating mirror mazes!

This enabled cross-curricular links across Art, DT and English.

Class 2 have worked collaboratively in their groups to design and create shadow puppet theatres. Within this, the children wrote their own play scripts creating a purpose for writing. The children had lots of fun showcasing their performances to the class!

Class 2 have enjoyed learning the recorder in music with Mrs Woodward and will be continuing this next term.

### Class 3 News

Once again, we have had a very busy and eventful half term! Monarchs was Class 3's topic. We have learnt about Victorians and Tudors. Our focus was Henry VIII and his wives and Queen Victoria. The children enjoyed drawing portraits and learning skills to create a clear face.





In English we have read the book Oliver Twist by Charles Dickens which has provoked curiosity about the Victorian times and has inspired some super pieces of writing.



In music we continued the theme and listen to Tudor music created on a Celeste.

In Geography we found cities in the UK and located counties. We identified human and physical features and linked this with Oliver Twist in London and also where monarchs in history lived.



In Science we looked at inheritance and adaption and that they are mutations. We looked at adaptive traits. We have also enjoyed a 'one off' Science lesson with Mr Harrison from Humphrey Perkins!

R.E we have focused on Christianity and our own beliefs, debating the creation story, and what it means to us.



We are currently involved in creating 'Bags of Kindness'. This is in partnership with the British Red Cross. We have had a series of lessons where the children understand the history of the charity and how it helps people in need today. The children will continue designing bags organising how to make money to put gifts into bags to give out to people who maybe on their own.

Swimming has been amazing in the village. The children are enjoying their Wednesday afternoons and their swimming styles are progressing well. Computing-MFL-PSHE have kept us all busy - subjects that we continue to learn and work hard in!
