#### Whole School News

Well, what a half term this has been! I can't quite believe we have been at school for 9 weeks since our last break. In that time the children have been working very hard and there is always an industrious buzz as you walk around the classrooms. Things have been very festive over the past couple of weeks and the children and staff are looking forward to Christmas and a break from school.

When we came back to school after the October break we were straight into Halloween and Bonfire celebrations. The children all enjoyed the Halloween disco which was organised and run by the PTA and raised ...... which will be used to enhance your child's education.

On Friday 10<sup>th</sup> November we all went across to the war memorial to hold a special assembly and remember those people who lost their lives in war. The children were very respectful and we all observed a 2 minute silence. Emily and Jenson did a reading and spoke clearly and confidently. They were also invited to do the same reading on Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> November at the Seagrave Village Memorial Service. Lots of the villagers commented on how well they spoke and behaved – well done Emily and Jenson.





On Monday 13<sup>th</sup> November we celebrated Diwali. At Seagrave we try to educate the children about different cultures and beliefs and help them to understand that we are all special in our own way. Mrs Litchfield decorated the retreat with lots of Hindu artefacts, costumes, activities and food. The children went in groups to have an immersive Diwali experience. They all enjoyed their session and learnt about the Hindu festival at the same time.

Things did not slow down the following week as we then embarked on Anti-bullying week. We pride ourselves at Seagrave on the good behaviour of all of our children and the discussions the children had during this week showed their maturity and understanding of the importance of our Anti-bullying work. The week began with Odd socks day where the children were invited to wear odd socks to show their solidarity against bullying. Each class also created a big collage sock containing each of our individual pictures to show that we are all unique but stick together against bullying.



At the end of this week we supported the BBC's Children in Need day. At Seagrave the children came to school dressed in spots and then joined in with different spotacular activities to raise money and have fun at the same time. Thank you to everyone who donated money.

This year our school is embarking on a mastery maths project. Mrs Chafer and Miss Penman are attending the meetings and training and then will disseminate the learning to the other staff in school. We are hoping this will have a positive impact in children's attitudes in maths and tackling reasoning and problem solving tasks.

Now we are in December, the school remains just as busy. The PTA worked very hard to set up the Christmas fair in the village hall which so many of you attended. The choir started off the festivities with their singing, there was a really happy Christmassy feel to the evening. The PTA were very pleased with the amount raised (£949.69) which again will be put towards purchasing items to enrich your child's education.



Some of the PTA money was spent on a pantomime for the school which took place on the 12<sup>th</sup> December. It was Robin Hood and the school spent a fun afternoon cheering, singing, booing and shouting "behind you!!". Thanks goes to the members of the PTA for organising this event and providing a huge chocolate coin for every child in the school.

As Christmas approached the classes began to take part in Christmas activities. Each class created some Christmas art work which has been displayed in the church in Seagrave. The parish were very grateful and are happy for any parents to go into the church to look at the lovely displays. Thank you to Miss Penman for co-ordinating this.





The EYFS and Class 1 children have been working very hard over the last few weeks to learn the songs, dances and words for their production of "It's a cracker". We performed it on Monday afternoon and evening. They sang well and the children who spoke projected their voices well so that the audience could hear every word. We were

very proud of them.

The Key stage 2 children decided to do things a little differently this year and performed a few songs in the village hall followed by hot chocolate and mince pies. It was lovely to see so many parents there supporting their child and getting into the Christmas spirit.










It has been an amazing half term and I hope all of the children have a fun filled Christmas and that Santa brings them everything they want – Merry Christmas everyone!

#### <u>Class 2 News</u>

As we reach the end of another busy and fun-filled half term, Ms Cook and I would like to say a huge thank you to Class 2. You have worked incredibly hard and continue to demonstrate determination, perseverance and resilience.





This term, Class 2 have had the opportunity to explore and learn about the natural environment during our Forest School lessons. This enabled the children to develop social and problem-solving skills when partaking in team building activities such as den and bridge building.

The children were also reminded of the fire safety rules and took part in fire lighting.

The hot chocolate and marshmallows were delicious!



The children have been working extremely hard in English and have produced an amazing non-chronological report all about Italy. This falls in line with our class topic 'World Pizza'.









Earlier this term, the children took part in a range of Diwali festivities. They tried Indian cuisine, made Rangoli patterns and tried on some traditional Indian clothing.

Class 2 enjoyed Science this term. We have been learning about electricity and how to create a complete circuit. The children tested materials, identifying conductors and insulators.

#### <u>Class 3 News</u>


Once again, we have had a very busy and eventful half term!

World War II was Class 3's topic.

During our Geography and History lessons, we learnt about the English counties that children were evacuated to, understanding why it was safe for children to live there and not in the cities. We discussed and debated physical and human features of our chosen county. We used conscience alleys to explore our ideas.



We have learned the reasons for WWII and placed events in chronological order. We looked at rationing and ration books – researched on computers using primary evidence.







In art and design we created wallpaper in the style of William Morris by transferring our design onto polystyrene and then using paint rollers to print the wall paper.

In Music we have listened to and learned about the singers/composers during the WWII era. From Vera Lyn and the Andrew sisters to Glen Miller's Big Band. The children also listened to Elgar's' 'Nimrod' which is always played at Remembrance Services. The children have sung 'a round' 'Hey Mr Miller' learning notation too.

During Science we looked at classifying living things using the Linnaean system. We matched groups of animals to their characteristics. We also described the useful and harmful effects of different microorganisms. We identified the variables in an investigation.

R.E – generated some 'BIG' questions. The children looked at similarities and differences between their views about life and death. This was treated with sensitivity and the children had experiences to share dealing with this in a mature way.



We also enjoyed exploring Diwali through dressing up, art and craft, stories and food tasting.
