We have had a busy term at Seagrave. Although it was not a long half term the children were as industrious as ever!



On January the 25th some of our Key stage 2 children attended the "Young voices" event at the NEC. It was an amazing day and the children sang their hearts out. They exhibited impeccable behaviour throughout and thoroughly enjoyed the experience.



As a school we marked Safer internet day in all of the classes. Technology is such a big part of the children's lives; it is important that we stay safe online.

This year Seagrave are working towards the Gold standard of the 'Beyond Bullying Award'. Mrs Chafer and the school council are leading the work and have already done assemblies and updated the child friendly anti-bullying policy. Although behaviour across the school is very good we have recruited 3 anti-bullying ambassadors who are there to support any children who may feel they have witnessed or are being bullied. After a letter from one of the pupils, the school council have also introduced "non-uniform day" on your birthday; which the children are very excited about!





This term we have introduced 'Happy Lunch Times' which has had a positive impact on the children's well being. The children have a rotation of different activities prepared by the lunchtime staff and can receive pompoms for being a great friend, helper etc. At the end of each half term 7 children are chosen to sit at the Captain's table with an adult of their choice — this has been very well received



by all the pupils and they are excitedly waiting to see who will be chosen next week.

In the week beginning 11th March, we celebrated British Science Week. The children had special science assemblies in their Key stages and then took part in lots of science investigations in their classes. It was lovely to see their enthusiasm and hear their scientific discussions and hypotheses.



On Thursday 7th March we celebrated World Book Day and the children all came dressed as book characters. The teachers swapped classes and enjoyed books and stories with different classes.



Over the past two weeks the whole school has been involved in planting bulbs and flowers both in the school grounds and in the village. We are looking forward to seeing them bloom in the late Spring.


The term started with a trip to Pizza Express. The children loved learning all about where pizza comes from, the ingredients used and even got to take their own pizza home- yummy!



In Computing, Class 2 have used Scratch for programming. They experimented different ways to control their sprite and debugged algorithms.



During Spring 1, the children took part in a 4-week TAG rugby programme hosted by The Leicester Tigers Foundation. This helped to promote sportsmanship and teamwork. We are hoping to apply the skills learnt by taking part in a tournament during the summer term.








In Design and Technology, Class 2 learnt about mechanical systems. We discussed techniques which we could use if we were to become inventors ourselves. The children then made gears and levers.



Class 2's science topic for this term is 'Plants'. The children have learnt the name of the different parts of a flowering plant and can explain the jobs that each part does. They also set up an investigation to find out how water is transported.











Class 2 have enjoyed swimming on a Wednesday afternoon at the local pool. It has been amazing to witness the children's progression and increase in confidence.

Class 3 News

As we come to the end of the Spring Term class 3 have been very busy and have produced some amazing pieces of work which have taken various forms.

Our **English lessons** initially focused on the children writing a quest. Developing their writing skills and deepening their understanding of grammar, punctuation and spelling. We moved on to looking at classical poetry that was developed through story. We focused on The Highwayman by Alfred Noyes. The children were able to broaden their vocabulary and engaged in writing a report about the death of Bess and the Highwayman.



In **Mathematics** the children daily work on their arithmetic, this daily consistency helps to embed the four basic operations in mathematics to help them problem solve other concepts they are learning. We have focused on multiplication and division in decimals, fractions and we have been looking at angles.

The Year 6 children are now well under way with their booster classes which take place after school on a Tuesday.

In **Geography and History** our topic is Russia. We have identified countries in Europe using maps and atlases. We have looked at Eastern Europe, images of landscapes developing our skills on lines of latitude.

We have identified some of the worlds dictators and discussed and researched what a democracy is and what the differences are. Stalin, Hitler and Mussolini took control of their countries. As you can imagine this topic brought up some very interesting discussions.




Art was light relief as we have focused on Kandinsky's work. A Russian artist who developed his colourful work through squares and concentric circles. The children enjoyed creating their own.

Music during the first half of the spring term developed our understanding of melody, tempo and dynamics. We listened to various pieces of music from different genres and then moved on to develop our composition skills using percussion instruments.

We recently looked at the composer Sergi Prokofiev. A Russian composer who developed his music by teaching children about the instruments of the orchestra through story. Class 3 enjoyed listening to his story of 'Peter and the Wolf', listening out for the characters played by the various instruments from the orchestra.





RE/PSHE- these subjects play a very important role in nurturing young minds, through daily mindfulness session we generate good discussion.

In RE looking at all religions is incredibly important in an ever changing and diverse world. Our thoughts have been directed at feelings about special places that mean something to us, we have focused on the Muslim community and their creativity.

This is a small window into our daily busy activities in class 3 and now it is time to recharge ready for a fun filled Summer term ahead.
