The SEN Information Report is part of a wider suite of documents relating to SEN, disability and inclusion which can be found on our website. In particular, it should be read alongside the school's SEND policy.

The school makes provision for the following kinds of SEND

Seagrave Village Primary School is an inclusive school. Children with needs across the four broad areas of SEND outlined in the 2014 code of practice are supported by experienced staff.

This includes but is not limited to:

- Autism
- ADHD
- Dyslexia
- Dvspraxia
- Social, Emotional and Mental Health needs (SEMH) including attachment
- Cognition and Learning disabilities
- Speech, language and interaction needs
- · Physical and sensory disabilities

The school identifies and assesses SEND by:

Class teachers and School leaders make regular assessments of progress for all pupils. From this, the school is able to identify pupils making less than expected progress given their age and individual circumstances.

When deciding whether to make special educational provision, a meeting will be arranged between the Parent, Senco and Class Teacher to consider all the information gathered from within the school.

During this collaborative meeting, the following will be discussed:

· the pupil's areas of strengths and difficulties



- any parent/carer concerns
- plans for any additional support or accommodations your child may receive
- any referrals to outside professionals, to support your child's learning.

Where a pupil is identified as having SEN&D, the school will seek to remove barriers to learning and put SEN&D provision in place.

The SEN&D support will take the form of a four-part cycle: **Assess** _ an analysis of pupils need will be carried out by the subject teacher and Senco.

Outside agencies may also be involved.

Plan - if the school decides to provide the pupils with SEN support parents/carers will be notified. All staff involved with the pupils will be informed nd trained where necessary **Do** - interventions & support will be delivered.

Review - the effectiveness of the intervention and or support will be reviewed regularly.

Seagrave Primary aims to work with the pupil and parents through this process

Seagrave Village Primary School will also support parents through:

- All staff in school including the Senior Leadership Team being available to discuss issues, appropriate to their roles in school.
- Your child's targets will be reviewed 3 times a year and we will work with you to plan and review these at parents meetings formally and informally throughout the year
- Our Senco's will meet with you once a year to discuss how you think things are going
- We will hold meetings with outside professionals where and when appropriate
- We will hold year information evenings/open evening
- We will share information with you about trust and local parent/carer support groups
- We will support you to access respite and support for yourself where available and appropriate e.g. application for holiday clubs for pupils with ADHD
